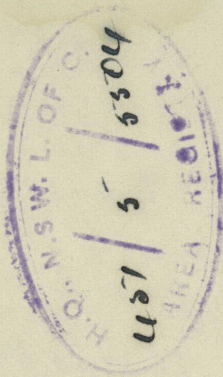

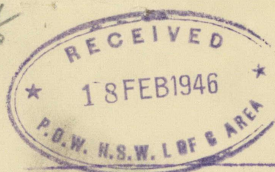

BREACH OF NATIONAL SECURITY (PW) REGS. - MR. L. OLIVER.

Attention is drawn to the following:-

At approximately 1330 hrs 14 FEB. 46 Capt. J. MORTON apprehended a Mr. L. OLIVER, of DARBY'S FALLS in conversation with PWI.64841 PIERACCINI Eliseo.

During interrogation, it was revealed that OLIVER had purchased a watch for the P.W. with money forwarded by P.W.

PW. PIERACCINI produced the watch and a search discovered a £1. Note - which had been returned to him by OLIVER - excess over purchase price of watch - £7.

2. PW. has held a position of trust in E.S.B. for a long period, and having some ability as an Artist, he has been granted permission to paint scenes, outside Group Area, but in areas adjacent. He states that he made the acquaintance of OLIVER while on these trips.
3. It is considered that, while PW. PIERACCINI is at fault, a lesson is needed by OLIVER to act as a deterrent to Civilians who are inclined to be over friendly with PW. - due to relations on Farms, while on Control Centres.
4. It is suggested that action could be taken under National Security (Prisoners of War) Regulations 40A.
5. Could a direction be made please.
